What we want appropriate adults to think about in age assessments



We are young people from the All4One group.

All of us are in the UK on our own, living in Greater Manchester. We have all had experience of the age assessment process. We want to make positive change and help others going through the age assessment process.

one

Recognise that your role is important.

two

Let us choose who the appropriate adult is. It should be somebody we trust.

three

Make clear who you are, what your role is and that you are there for us.

four

Make notes of questions and answers. These can be an important record of what happened and whether things have been interpreted properly.

five

Support us and reassure us though the process. It is very difficult.

six

Look out for us and our best interests; ask us if we need a break and please intervene if there is a problem.
